

Contributors Make a Long-Term Investment in Families

Investing in our future was the theme when Family Resource Center St. Croix Valley board member Bill Findlay and his wife Ann hosted a gathering at their home this fall. The couple has been supportive of the Resource Center since its inception, with Ann having participated in the committee that worked to form the organization. The event was a fundraiser for the Bright Futures Long-Term Fund, an endowment-like fund that was established with the St. Croix Valley Foundation in 2006.

Trudy Popenhagen was among the guests that evening, and she shared a story about her late aunt Mona Faye, who made a bequest to the Family Resource Center St. Croix Valley upon her passing in 2015. Trudy said that as her aunt was getting on in years, she decided she wanted to do something more to support the work of nonprofit organizations. "She said, 'Would you suggest someone that helps with kids?' because that was really her first love," Trudy recounted. "I knew about the Family Resource Center and I knew about the great programs they have, and I knew that they would take care of any donation that she was willing to give."

Board Vice President Aaron Mork then made an appeal to guests for their support, stating, "Many of the families we work with look just like yours or mine, but some of our families face challenges including poverty, substance abuse, homelessness, mental illness, and learning to parent as a teenager. Aaron cited research conducted by the Federal Reserve Bank that most effective form of economic development comes when we invest in our children. "For every dollar invested, according to Mr. Arthur Rolnick of the Federal Reserve, the return is \$12," he remarked. "For example, our total investment in a family that's involved in home visiting for 3 years is approximately \$9,000. With a 12 times return on your investment, the total return to the community is \$108,000."

All donations received as part of the event were matched up to \$4,500, thanks to the generosity of Xcel Energy and an anonymous donor, resulting in nearly \$10,000 invested in the Bright Futures Long-Term Fund. It is anticipated that, with adequate investment over time, this Fund will provide increased financial sustainability for future work of the Family Resource Center St. Croix Valley.

Whether it is a gift today to the annual fund or Bright Futures Long-Term Fund, your support is an investment in families and the future of our community.
