MAY IS MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH

The month of May is Mental Health Awareness Month, created to increase public awareness of mental health conditions and break down the silence and stigma that may be isolating to those experiencing symptoms.

"Paying attention to your mental health is equally important as your physical health," shares Jennifer Griggs-Andress, Executive Director of Mental Health Task Force (MHTF) of Polk County.

The goal of MHTF is to work collaboratively to increase mental health literacy, improve access to mental health services and reduce suicides to zero in Polk County. The MHTF works collaboratively with mental health care providers, government and law enforcement representatives, human service agencies, school personnel, and community members.

"We want to help bring awareness of resources in the community. People are hesitant to address possible mental health needs due to stigma. We are here to help reduce the stigma. We want to promote a strength-based approach and look at how we can build resilience in our community members."

Much of the work of the MHTF moving forward will be about collaboration.

"There are so many amazing resources in Polk County, including Family Resource Center St. Croix Valley. We know that the work Family Resource Center does supports families. We know that meaningful community connections can impact mental health in a positive way," said Jennifer.

Early intervention and seeking help are key in addressing symptoms of mental illness and can prevent further decline. Know that there is help available. For more information, contact Jennifer at jenniferga@mentalhealthpolk.org.

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FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK



As I write this column in February 2021 I think back to last February – no mention of COVID in the Winter 2020 Family Matters edition. Hard to believe how much the world has turned since then.

Despite the ongoing challenges of the pandemic, Family Resource Center has consistently been there for families in our region. Beginning in late

March 2020 our home visits were conducted by phone or video. While all in-person programming was suspended in March, we began offering programs virtually by May—including Welcome Baby visits to parents of newborns in hospitals and Baby & Me classes.

We expanded our Triple P (Positive Parenting Program) offerings and launched a new evidence-based parent education program called *Early Childhood Families and Schools Together (ECE FAST)*. We also invested significantly in professional development of our staff. While we miss connecting in-person the response to virtual programming has been positive—especially during the winter months.

2020 BY THE NUMBERS

Every year we track the unduplicated count of participants in our programs. Here are some highlights from 2020 (watch for our annual report in June for more information). We served 113 families with 1,600 home visits in our Parents as Teachers program. We served 23 families with Triple P home visits. We visited 169 families of newborns sponsored by the United Way Success By 6 partnership with Western Wisconsin Health, St. Croix Regional Medical Center, Osceola Medical Center, Westfields Hospital and Clinic, and Amery Hospital and Clinic. We trained 12 family service professionals in the Protective Factors. In our group connections we served 203 individuals.

PRESCHOOL DEVELOPMENT INNOVATION GRANT

We are excited to announce that Family Resource St. Croix Valley was one of eight innovation grants funded by the Wisconsin Dept. of Children and Families. The \$50,000 grant is to implement a strategy to expand early childhood education opportunities and engage the private sector business community to join the effort to enhance early childhood education opportunities.
