## BABY & ME GOES VIRTUAL: NEW MOM SHARES STORY OF SUPPORT. COMMUNITY, AND SENSORY PLAY

Welcoming a new baby can be overwhelming. Among other challenges it comes with sleep deprivation and lots of questions. Pre-pandemic, many parents already felt isolated and alone. When in-person programming was suspended last spring, Family Resource Center St. Croix Valley knew it was critical to adapt to the ever-changing world to meet the needs of families.

In June, Family Resource Center launched virtual Baby & Me, allowing parents from anywhere in our service area (and beyond) to connect with other new parents.

"After delivering Evie in May 2020, one of the things I grieved was that the hospital we delivered at wasn't offering mother-baby classes," says Danielle Chollett, program participant. "I was so excited when I saw Family Resource Center was offering a virtual class during this unique time. It has been a great substitute to in-person classes given the current status of the world."

Asked what she enjoys most about virtual Baby & Me, Danielle says, "Sensory play! I learned so many great ways to incorporate sensory play throughout all 12 months of baby's first year; both from Family Resource Center staff and other fellow moms in the group. The discussions really help me think outside of the box about play that incorporates all five senses."



"Virtual Baby & Me has allowed me to connect to other moms during this time that I wouldn't have otherwise had, had I not registered for the class," said Danielle. "It allowed me to be a part of a community of moms who encourage each other, especially when being a new mom sometimes feels lonely and isolating and especially so during a pandemic."

"It has been a wonderful experience participating in Virtual Baby & Me," said Danielle. "I would highly recommend it to any new moms seeking support and community with other new moms, and for moms who seek to gain useful information on several relevant topics regarding raising babies during their first year of life."

Baby & Me groups are facilitated on Zoom by two Family Resource Center Parent Educators. Each session has a featured topic and provides an opportunity for parents to discuss topics of their choice.

"I loved that the Baby & Me participants were very supportive of each other and open to suggestions from others who had been through similar situations," says parent educator Lori Ollig. "Even though participants were not faceto-face, they were still able to make connections with one another." (Continued on page 3)



### **STAFF SPOTLIGHT: PARENT EDUCATOR LEAD ROBBYN BOWMAN ALWAYS READY TO GROW** PROFESSIONALLY

Ready to learn and grow, Robbyn Bowman joined the staff of Family Resource Center as a Parent Educator in 2013 and became a Parent Educator Lead in 2016. Before joining Family Resource Center, Robbyn was the Children & Youth Advocate at a domestic violence shelter. She saw the role change as an opportunity to grow both personally and professionally. "I enjoy learning overall," said Robbyn. "I love that Family Resource Center

strongly focuses on professional development for each staff member, I continue to gain knowledge to help me become successful in my role and aid in my personal growth."

Robbyn's favorite trainings focus on childhood trauma and resiliency and how it affects child development. In 2018 and 2019 Robbyn attended the Drug Endangered Children National Conference. "Attending this training, both years, has been fulfilling. Many of the families we work with have been affected by addiction in some way," she said. 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## FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK

While COVID-19 has brought many personal and professional challenges to our community in 2020, it has also rendered new opportunities for innovation, creativity, and collaboration. I appreciate the comment made by one of our partner hospital leaders who said recently, "Never let a crisis go to waste." The pandemic requires us to do things differently and challenges us to do things better.

In this newsletter you will see examples of new collaborations and innovations in programming. See the story of how one mom with a newborn benefitted from the pivot from in-person Baby & Me group connections to a virtual program. She described how the online program helped her connect with other families with babies for information and support.

Another upcoming virtual offering is Bringing the Protective Factors to Life in Your Work. This is tailored to professionals working with families. The curriculum consists of six 2-hour courses on Mondays starting in September.

Read about the new pilot program for early childhood education based on the evidence-based Families and Schools Together (FAST) program. This opportunity was made possible as part of the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families Preschool Development Grant. We are one of five family resource centers in the state to offer this pilot program for multi-family groups with children age two-to-three. Typically offered in person, we will offer two cycles of this program online this fall. The first session starts in September. Evidence shows that participating in the weekly groups at least 6 times consistently achieves positive child well-being outcomes for young children and their families. Please help spread the word about this new opportunity.

I would like to send a warm shout out to Dotty Lillo, Director of Western Dairyland Childcare Child Care Partnership Resource & Referral, who retires this month after 20 years of leadership in early childhood education and care work in our region. Thank you Dotty for making a positive difference in the lives children and families in Western Wisconsin.
